We are One Family

Imagine not being able to attend Mass as a family, worshiping God together, because the lights, sounds, crowds or other stimuli could trigger a behavioral outburst in a family member, or the person finds the stimuli extremely uncomfortable. Splitting up for Mass is often the only viable option for families with special -needs children or adult disabled members. Some families prefer to make this choice rather than risk aggressive behaviors or receive disapproving looks from other churchgoers.

Unconditional Love

As Catholics we believe that all people are made in the image and likeness of God, and that all the baptized share in the life and mission of the Church.

Everyone desires and deserves our

love and support. This includes people from every range of ability. As a parish, we are mindful and respectful of families who have children or adult members with disabilities, or mental illness. Our faith calls us to help each member of our parish community enter into the Mass as fully as he/she is able. Let us model the welcoming ministry of Jesus, seeking always to see the image of God in every person.



The Sensory Mass at Our Lady of Guadalupe

What is a Sensory Mass? Simply put, it's a quieter Mass, with less stimuli. While every person is unique, some of us have sensory processing challenges, speech/language delays, a lack of social integration skills, and self-esteem issues. We may miss some social cues, have difficulty coping with sudden changes in routine, and may be sensitive to sound, light, texture, smell or touch.

Now, to better serve these individuals, OLG will provide additional accommodations at the 11 a.m. Mass on the second Sunday of each month.

Families and adults with disabilities can join us for Mass in the Saint Juan Diego Chapel or in the main Church.

The Chapel offers an alternative worship space where Mass is streamed, and lights and sounds can be lowered to lessen stimuli.

Sensory Mass: A Quieter Worship Place

Accommodations in the Saint Juan Diego Chapel:

- Private entrance via the Saint Francis Courtyard
- Private bathroom
- Lower volume on TV to watch Mass
- Calm/quiet area
- No incense
- Dimmed lights

Feel free to bring comforting toys, noise-cancelling headphones, sun glasses and more to make you or your family members more comfortable.
