



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Merry Christmas! As we celebrate Christmas, we give pause to reflect on this past year, which has been filled with much trauma, both inside and outside the Church, specifically with regard to the sexual abuse scandal of the clergy, moral issues, social upheavals and political volatility, both nationally and internationally. Many of us feel deeply betrayed by those whom we have long held in high regard. It might interest you to know that scandal from within and persecution from without are not new phenomena to Holy Mother Church. We have only to reach into the long history of the Church to see example after example. So while recent events have caused great pain, we have this long and rich history to reflect upon; for it is within in each of those most difficult periods of history that the Church has raised up some of her greatest Saints. Might the Lord be calling us in this important moment of our history?



In these past few years, there has been plenty of fodder to feed the evil forces of our time. Saint Peter gives us some practical advice: "Stay sober and alert. Your opponent the devil is prowling like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him solid in your faith..." (I Peter 5: 8-9) Now more than ever we need authentic witnesses to add value to our one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. So while these particular times are filled with suffering and are tumultuous, to say the least, it is not a time without hope. For it was to just such a world that our God sent His only begotten Son to bring healing, hope and mercy to a world filled with fragile peace and broken promises. "The light shines on in darkness, a darkness that did not overcome it." (John 1:5) Remember that Emmanuel means, God is with us, he cares for us and wants to be intimately involved with our personal lives, in order to make a difference in the world. We have only to invite him into our hearts.

BLESSED SACRAMENT

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is held each first Friday after the 8 a.m. Mass. Concludes with Benediction at 4 p.m.

NEW PARISHIONERS

New parishioners are encouraged to register at the parish office as soon as possible after moving into the parish.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Religious instruction for elementary school students takes place on Monday and Tuesday evenings during the school year.

RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION)

Confessions are held 1/2 hour before each weekend Mass; until 10 minutes before Mass or anytime by appointment.

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK

If you anticipate a procedure or surgery, contact the Parish Office so proper arrangements may be made at the church or in your home to receive the Sacraments of the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion prior to your hospital visit.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

For those unable to attend Sunday Mass due to illness or age (whether long term or for a period of time), arrangements can be made for Holy Communion every week by an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. You can also be placed on a list for visitation by a parish priest on a regular basis.

EMERGENCIES

In case of an emergency, which requires a priest, please contact the parish office at any time. Directions will be given on how to contact a priest. All area hospitals and nursing care facilities have a parish assigned to them and each institution will be able to assist you. Additionally, contact the parish office, so that the priests are aware of the situation and can assist as appropriate.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Arrangements for the Sacrament of Marriage must be made at least six months prior to your anticipated wedding date.

BAPTISM OF CHILDREN

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered twice a month on Sundays after the 11 a.m. Mass. Parents having their first child Baptized are required to attend Pre-Jordan Classes.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION (RCIA)

RCIA prepares adolescents and adults for Baptism and full communion in the Catholic Church.
