


ADVENT MESSAGE SERIES


ASSISTANCE AT MASS

HEARING ASSISTANCE DEVICES

We have hearing assistance devices for parishioners to borrow during Mass to make it easier to hear the service. We have eight wireless devices which can be borrowed from an usher for the duration of the Mass. The devices should be returned at the end of Mass. The wireless device requires an earphone or head-set to accompany it. These items connect to the wireless device and can be purchased with a \$10 donation. The earphone or head-set is kept by the parishioner and should be brought to Mass each week for use with the borrowed wireless device.
